  opting to use a different organization
- 2 successor clients waiting:
  - Elizabeth & Coco College student who postponed current semester to receive successor SD after Coco's death
  - o Amy Jenner Current SD is 10 and aging out; forward planning

**Kathy F/Sgt.Maj.H.T.**: Note the achievement regarding successor dogs because of the quantity of other Service Dog "training" programs

**Lu P**: Monica LaPeter is continuing to fundraise even though she is paid in full for Team Training through Leah Levine's *Animals at Work* organization sponsorship and ECAD will apply all funds raised through her efforts to her account and roll over the Levine sponsorship to other client who needs help

**Rick L**: Notes Donna Burke's fundraising efforts w/ Butterfly Energy and encourages Board Members to attend her November event

**Lu P**: Notes Donna Burke will be designating surplus funds raised to help other Long Island residents who need Service Dogs

**Lu P**: 17 dogs in 2014 - 3 breeders = 14 dogs
